A New Year





Review of 2013

Essentially the past year has been one of consolidation and transition for our Group. Early on in the year we changed our name to better to reflect the spread of our membership and to focus on our aims for prostate cancer support in the wider Aylesbury area. With every good wish (and a financial grant!) we became independent of the Chiltern Support Group based in High Wycombe. We were then able to join the national Prostate Support Federation from whom we have also received financial assistance and input into development of our aims.



Our awareness week campaign required a move from Friars Square, Aylesbury to the shopping centre in Hale Leys. This attracted greater attention than previously and our volunteers were kept busy throughout the week with questions and requests for information. We shall be returning there in March.

Using our recent donations and grants, the committee decided to upgrade our presentation equipment with the purchase of a specially designed and branded gazebo, together with banners and table covers. This was first shown at our stand at the Thame & Oxford Show in July to great effect and made our presentation very professional and welcoming. Despite being one of the hottest days of the year we attracted a lot of attention. In 2014 the Show has moved back to its original date in September and we shall be there!

In October, we belatedly had our first meeting to which wives and partners were invited. Professor Hoskin from Mount

Vernon, an acknowledged expert on radiotherapy, spoke to a meeting of almost forty of us. His talk was well received and drew a host of questions afterwards. He has promised to return at our request.

For the first time, we ventured to the Whiteleaf Golf Club for our Christmas Lunch. Unfortunately we did not draw the support we had anticipated. However, it was an excellent event, much enjoyed by all attending and we hope the word will spread.

Report on Federation Workshop

Brian, Roger and Bruce attended a Prostate Cancer Federation workshop held at the University of Birmingham in November. This was a packed day with many speakers, unfortunately with limited time for networking. Nevertheless it was most informative and enabled us to make some valuable contacts.

We learnt of some extensive PSA testing by one support group on the South coast that really helped to raise awareness of prostate cancer and identify high risk individuals who might not otherwise have been checked out.

Perhaps the highlight of the day was a very interesting talk from Mark Newbold, Chair of the Heart of England NHS Foundation Trust. He talked about how support groups can work more closely with local NHS trusts and Commissioning Groups. Here was someone who switched professions from medicine to management and spoke with real conviction and passion.

Prostate Cancer UK also had a session where they introduced a proposal for closer affiliation with support groups. This caused some confusion as this is exactly what the Federation is trying to do. It is clear more needs to be done at the top of the two organisations to speak with one voice.

We also learnt that the Federation will be hosting the European wide meeting of Prostate Cancer Organisations next year in London.

Overall an interesting day even though Bruce is still complaining Roger pinched his sausage at lunch!
