



## Hale Leys Awareness Week



## Cancer Drugs Fund Petition

You will probably have heard that the Cancer Drugs Fund are proposing the withdrawal of 25 life-saving cancer drugs on March 12th, including one for the treatment of prostate cancer, Cabazitaxel. Our national organisation Tackle Prostate Cancer, has joined a coalition of other leading cancer charities and together are campaigning for these proposals to be withdrawn. This is something terribly important to those patients for whom this offers possibly the only treatment option available to them. **Time is short, so if you have not done so already, please consider adding your name to the petition.**



## Music for the Prostate


